Meet the Commander:

This is my first newsletter as your newly elected Commander. My name is Edward Weaverling and I am a retired U.S. Navy Senior Chief. I am truly a "Cold War" veteran. I went into service in 1971 during the Vietnam War and retired after the first Gulf War. During my career, I helped build and put into commission the USS South Carolina CGN-37, USS Dwight D. Eisenhower CVN-69 and USS Abraham Lincoln CVN-72. When deployed, I spent time doing things like chasing the Russians around the Mediterranean, conducting FON (freedom of navigation) operations along Colonel Gaddafi's "Line Of Death" and attempting to rescue hostages as part of Operation Eagle Claw to free the personnel taken when the Iranian Embassy was overrun. My travels took me to the Caribbean, North Atlantic, North Sea, Mediterranean, Black Sea, South Atlantic, South Pacific and Indian Ocean. When I retired, I found that ships were still in my veins. For three and a half years, I worked in a shipyard helping build three more aircraft carriers.

I relocated back to my home state of Missouri to be with my extended family.

Before taking on the role of 3rd District Commander, I was the 3rd District Sgt-At-Arms and the Commander of Post 285 in Hamilton, Missouri.

Membership

Maintaining our membership numbers continues to be a never-ending challenge. Many of our elder comrades are being lost to the passage of time and recruiting new members to replace their numbers is difficult. My parent post has lost five (5) comrades in the last year. (There is one post in District 3 that has lost ten (10) members.)

Increasing our numbers is an even bigger challenge. With Covid-19 and its variants out there, not too many veterans are looking for more groups to associate with. So what do we do? We need to go after the inactive members that think of us as just another magazine subscription . . . the Post 1000 members. When a veteran joins the American Legion directly through National or Department, they are assigned to Post 1000 (administrative post). These are the members you can easily search for through myLegion.org

Post 1000 members are already members so your post recruiting battle is partly won. Now you just need to talk them into transferring into your post. Be sure to combine your recruiting call with a "Buddy Check". With Afghanistan back in Taliban hands & Covid variants abounding, many veterans might welcome the friendly voice of a fellow veteran.

Start with the 1000AD members that are paid up first. This way they will know you are not calling for money. If possible, have the caller be from the same service era and service branch. If they claim to be too busy to participate in post activities, just tell them your goal is to more easily keep them informed of local activities that might be of interest to them.

The National organization has enough funds to support the sponsoring of an Indy race car team while the Department of Missouri is having to cut costs just to survive. If we can get a post 1000AD member to transfer into a Missouri post, a portion of their dues formerly going to National will come to Missouri instead.

It's the final quarter of the membership year, please process your renewals expeditiously and manage those renewal notice cut-off dates so that members who have renewed are processed before they get another notice. Ideally, everyone is renewed by 31 Dec. They would have received 3 renewal notices by then, and hopefully many reminders by Post leadership.

January, non-renewed members are delinquent.
February, suspended without voting privileges.
June, dropped.

Why is membership so important? Membership drives our programs benefitting our Veterans, active duty military, and the community at large, and our programs drive membership. We cannot continue to do what we do effectively without the strongest membership possible.

POW-MIA Empty Chair

This quarter we extend honors to the Missouri MIA's that resulted from the sinking of the USS Indianapolis CA-35 in World War Two.

In July 1945, Indianapolis completed a top-secret high-speed trip to deliver parts of Little Boy, the first nuclear weapon ever used in combat, to the island of Tinian, and subsequently departed for the Philippines for training. At 0015 on 30 July, the ship was torpedoed by the Imperial Japanese Navy submarine I-58, and sank in 12 minutes. Of 1,195 crewmen aboard, approximately 300 went down with the ship. The remaining 890 faced exposure, dehydration, saltwater poisoning, and shark attacks while stranded in the open ocean with few lifeboats and almost no food or water. The Navy only learned of the sinking four days later, when survivors were spotted by the crew of an aircraft on routine patrol. Only 316 survived. [Eight (8) of our Missouri comrades are amongst the missing.] The sinking of *Indianapolis* resulted in the greatest single loss of life at sea from a single ship in the history of the US Navy.

- On Sept. 25th we posted colors for the opening of the Fall Festival in Bethany.

- On the evening of Sept. 25 the local drag strip, Thunder Valley Raceway, had a Veterans Recognition night. We posted colors, Comrade Richard Graner sang the national anthem, we gave a rifle salute and played taps for the opening. This was conducted by Bethany American Legion Post 216 and VFW Post 2176.

- We have assisted in 3 military funerals over the last few months.

- July 4 conducted panhandling downtown handed out grave marker flags for free asking for donations. Raised approximately \$1600.

Kansas City VA Medical Center Offers COVID-19 Vaccine Boosters

Kansas City – The Kansas City VA Medical Center (KCVA) will offer Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine boosters under Emergency Use Authorization. This decision follows the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) announcement authorizing a booster dose of Pfizer vaccine and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) recommendations, as follows:

- Individuals who **should** get a Pfizer COVID-19 booster include:
 - People 65 years and older and residents in long-term care settings who received a Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 primary vaccine series at least six months ago
 - People 50 to 64 years old with underlying medical conditions who received a Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 primary vaccine series at least six months ago
- Individuals who **may** opt to get a Pfizer COVID-19 booster dose, based on their individual benefits and risks, including:
 - •
 - People 18 to 49 years old with underlying medical conditions who received a Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 primary vaccine series at least six months ago
 - People 18 to 64 years old who are at increased risk for COVID-19 exposure and transmission because of their occupational or institutional setting who received a Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 primary vaccine series at least six months ago

Veterans who meet these criteria and would like to receive the Pfizer COVID-19 booster can ask for it during any upcoming clinic visit or at one of the following walk-in vaccine clinics scheduled in the Hall of Heroes (Linwood campus main hospital):

- Friday, Oct. 1, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Wednesday, Oct. 6, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Thursday, Oct. 7, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.
- Friday, Oct. 8, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Additionally, KCVA will offer the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine boosters during the drive-thru flu vaccine clinics already schedule at the Linwood campus:

- Saturday, Oct. 2, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.
- Sunday, Oct. 3, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Both the walk-in and drive-thru clinics are open to Veterans, CHAMPVA recipients, Veteran's spouses and caregivers under the authority of the SAVE LIVES Act, as supply and capacity permits. Anyone requesting a booster must be 18 years or older and meet the FDA and CDC's guidelines for a booster dose. Persons coming in for a booster dose should bring their vaccine card with them.

Currently, only the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine has been authorized as a booster shot. FDA and CDC continue to review data to determine whether and when a booster might be recommended for recipients of the Moderna and Johnson & Johnson (J&J)/Janssen) COVID-19 vaccine(s). VA will plan to offer boosters of these vaccines if authorized and recommended.

KCVA remains deeply dedicated to the health and wellbeing of the Veterans we serve. Thank you for choosing us for your healthcare needs as we work together to end this pandemic.
