IF YOUR POST DISAPPEARED TODAY, WOULD ANYONE NOTICE?



Take a good hard look at your post and its value to those around you. Do so honestly & with a critical eye. Is your post an asset to your local community? Is your post an asset to the veteran community?

Revisit the 4 pillars listed below and evaluate your post performance in each area. Ask yourselves "Can we do better?" & "Is there more we can do?"

Pillar One: Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Pillar Two: National Security Pillar Three: Americanism Pillar Four: Children & Youth

Do you properly fly your flags and keep them in good condition as an example to your community. Do you post flags in the community on flag holidays? Does your post provide funeral honors for veteran funerals? Does your post have a color guard? Are you active in your local schools? Do you promote youth programs like Boy's State? Oratorical? Scouting? Cadet Law Enforcement? Do you hold fundraisers to support legion programs? Do you support local charities. Is your "Buddy Check" program consistently being worked twice per year (around Veterans Day & around the American Legion Birthday)?

DISTRICT MEETING

Clyde Gustine Post 236 of Excelsior Springs hosted the District Meeting on the 11th of September at 1300.

Attendance was better than normal. Zone 2 Vice Commander George Shepard was our guest speaker. Quite a few other legionnaires were present but only 5 of our 26 posts were represented.

While we would like to have all 26 post Commanders and their adjutants present, anyone can attend. District meetings are not just for district staff. They are a chance for post officers to interact with District staff. In the near future, training is going to be offered during the meeting to support you in your post membership retention and recruiting.

Four to five Posts have been setting the budget, approving donations, electing officers for as long as I have been attending. We need <u>more</u> participation on the district level. We have various committee positions we can't find anyone to fill. We have District Officer positions that we need candidates for. POW-MIA EMPTY CHAIR

The POW/MIA honoree for this quarter is Private Merlin R. Calvin from Saint Louis, Missouri.

Merlin enlisted in the United States Army Air Forces and served during World War II. He was attached to the 20th Air Force, 29th Bombardment Group, 6th Bombardment Squadron as Left Gunner on a B-29 Superfortress.

On May 5, 1945 his B-29 took off from the North Field on Guam for a precision bombing mission against an airfield in Japan.

Eyewitnesses reported that the aircraft was attacked by Japanese fighters and crashed at 36°46'N and 132°15'E. Eight parachutes were seen to open, but the identity of who bailed out could not be determined. When this plane failed to return, the entire crew was listed as '*Missing In Action*' (MIA).

Some of the men that bailed out were captured, and later executed on June 20, 1945, shot or beheaded while POWs. Merlin R Calvin was one of these POWs.

LEST WE FORGET

<u>DÉJÀ VU</u>

Are you seeing things? Is this the current newsletter or an old one? Didn't you see that article in the last issue? Maybe you did and maybe you didn't!

Important things are worth repeating. Yes, some of the articles you have seen before. Some are similar but have been updated. Others are totally new. Do yourself and me a favor and read through it before you judge it. (NOTE: It might be more interesting if more members contributed to it.)

HOSTING POSTS NEEDED

Can your post host a district meeting? Most posts could if they wanted too. If a post is willing to host a district meeting, they will receive $\$100^{00}$ from District. As host, you provide the facility, the main food course and the drinks (iced tea, water, coffee). The rest of the potluck meal is side dishes brought by meeting attendees. Meetings are held on the second Sunday of December, March & June at 1500. Food is served following the meeting. We still need hosts for meetings on 12/11/22, 3/12/23 and 6/11/23. Please let me know if your post wishes to volunteer.



FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

We are all mature, fiscally responsible adults. We go through life paying our bills as they come due. However, it seems that some of our comrades don't think paying their annual dues on time is necessary. The collection of dues for 2023 has started and they are supposed to be paid by January 1, 2023! If dues are not

paid by Jan. 1 of each calendar year, the member becomes delinquent. Feb. 1, the member is suspended, June 30, the member is dropped from the membership rolls.

NOTE: The Department of Missouri realizes that some members are going to pay late and has set monthly goals for the posts that increase by approximately 5% per month. The 100% goal date is 17MAY23.

How is your post doing with renewals? Go to <u>www.missourilegion.org</u> and look at the district report on the membership page. The three rightmost columns are the important ones.

Conclusion: <u>Anybody that hasn't paid their 2022 dues are extremely late</u>. Be responsible and <u>get them paid</u>! If you haven't paid your dues for 2023 yet, pay soon. Posts reaching 100% by December 31, 2022 will receive awards And this goal can be easily reached.

BUDDY CHECKS – POST 1000 MEMBERS

Making these calls is essential to keeping these comrades in the legion. They may have joined online to try the legion out. A personal call welcoming them to the legion and inviting them to transfer to a local post is the key to retaining them as members and getting them involved. And don't be selfish . . . if the member is interested in an American Legion program your post doesn't support (i.e. baseball), help them connect with a post that is active in that program. Involved members doing things that interest them are the kind of members that participate and stay with the Legion.

BUDDY CHECK – POST ROSTER

Show your older and less active members the respect they deserve. Even though they don't come to meetings anymore, let them know that their membership is still valued. Make sure you have good contact information for them so that you can keep them informed of post activities. If they don't drive anymore, consider having a member give them a ride to a meeting. Look closely at your roster. You may spot a member that has maintained a continuous membership for decades but they have suddenly fallen behind in paying their dues. Show some concern. They may be having personal issues (health, financial, etc). As a post, offer help if you can. Consider offering to pay their dues for the current year so that they won't have to worry about losing their continuous membership status. If your post is well situated financially, you might consider making them a 'Life Member'. (Note: A Life member is a member that is officially adopted by the post and the post is obligated to pay their dues for the rest of their life.)

SUICIDE PREVENTION

As a society, we have an ongoing problem of suicide within our communities, especially amongst our veterans. Local help is available for the asking. Tony Gardner is a member of Gower Memorial Post 393 and a member of the "Missouri Veterans Suicide Prevention Team".



The team was founded by Jon Sabala, Missouri Department of Mental Health Veterans Service Officer. This team of volunteers conducts suicide prevention training around the state. Currently there are only a handful of team

to

the American Legion, DAV and VFW challenging them to host training at the district level and post level. Having him conduct a training session at your post would be a great public relations opportunity. You could make it a community event open to the public. After all, veterans are not the only potential suicide group. Teen suicide is also on the rise and the public could receive some much needed, potentially life-saving information.

MYLEGION.ORG

The system still has issues but use it if you can. If you encounter a problem, use the 'help' button and click on 'known issues' to see if the problem has already been reported. If it hasn't been reported, do so. The system is only going to get better if we use it and provide feedback. This system is invaluable to Post Commanders, Post Adjutants & Post Membership Chairpersons. The search functions will help you locate Post 1000 members to potentially transfer into your post and the administrative functions are designed to make the Adjutant's job much easier.

ONLINE TRAINING = TRAINING TUESDAYS

The last Tuesday of each month American Legion National Headquarters staff will present 60-90 minute sessions on topics aimed at post commanders and adjutants. (Although all members can benefit from this training.) If you participate in one of these 'live' sessions, you can ask questions and get immediate answers. If you miss a session, no problem. Each session will be recorded and made available for later viewing online.



ONLINE TRAINING = BASIC TRAINING

On-line course consisting of 6 lesson units and 1 exam unit. Self-paced. You can log out and log back in whenever you have free time. Upon successful completion, you will receive a link to a web page to print out a course completion

diploma. Graduation also qualifies you for an "American Legion Education Institute" lapel/hat pin. (History / Veteran Affairs & Rehabilitation / National Security / Americanism / Children & Youth / Course Conclusion / Final Exam). As an incentive, I will buy the pin for any member that shows me that they successfully completed the course while I am District Commander.

IMAGE, IMAGE, IMAGE . . .

Continue to work on your public image. How does the public perceive you? Do they think you're just a few crotchety old geezers that put out flags occasionally and spend the rest of your time sitting around drinking beer and telling 'war stories'. Take advantage of every opportunity to present your American Legion post to the public in a positive light. Hold an informal 'workshop' session at your post to brainstorm PR and recruiting ideas. Make plans and execute the best ideas.

As an example, here is what I am doing in Hamilton:

★To provide good PR (Public Relations) for the American Legion and my local post (Boutwell-Clark-Craven-Eads Post 285), I personally serve as Vice President at the local county food pantry. I do so wearing a Legion shirt/sweatshirt & hat. I work as the customer service person at the door and do all the carry-out to the cars/trucks of the patrons receiving food. The public readily sees the support the Legion is providing to help feed people in need.

★To provide additional good PR (Public Relations) for the American Legion, my local post (Boutwell-Clark-Craven-Eads Post 285) and American Legion Auxiliary Unit 285, we collectively allow the "Second Harvest Community Food Bank" of Northwest Missouri to conduct a <u>monthly</u> food distribution event in front of our legion hall. Citizens in line to receive food line up behind the local football stadium and I am one of two people that control the line, collect data and send them one-at-a-time to the loading area in front of the post. Needless to say, again I do all this wearing Legion logo-wear so that they know the legion is an active part of the event.

This will be a one-day intensive revitalization event scheduled from 0900-1600 but if we have enough people to work the phones, we can get it done in less time. There should be light refreshments available during the day and a lunch available for participants so we can continue to work through lunch.

National Vice Commander Glenn Wahus (North Dakota) will be in attendance and he plans to help man the phones and go visit local veterans. Additional attendees will include National HQ Staff, 2-3 Department Staff (Commander Rose Noonan [possibly], Senior Vice Commander Mark Clark, Adjutant Lowry Finley-Jackson, Zone 2 Vice Commander George Shepard), Myself, District 3 Staff, and as many Post Commanders/Adjutants/Members as I can persuade to participate.

Our National HQ Staff will assist in advertising the event and we will have a Dept of MO Service Officer available at the event so veterans in your communities can come and speak to him about VA Services and benefits. All materials required for a successful event will be provided by National HQ and our Dept Staff. What I need from every Post in our District is volunteers to make the phone calls and conduct visits with local veterans if necessary.

With our membership goals this year we have a real chance to achieve 100% membership and revitalizations are a great way to move members at large into your local posts and to reach out to expired members and get them back in the fold. Together we can do great things and I look forward to the National Vice Commander coming to our District and in having him work side by side with you and your members to help revitalize our district.

As far as working the lists, each post can certainly call the folks on their delinquent roster and those on the AD and MO 1000 rosters in the zip codes surrounding their posts. National will send out post cards letting all members both current and past in our zip codes know that we will be holding the event so our calls <u>will not be cold calls</u>. Rosters, transfer forms, and a script to follow will be provided for those not comfortable just calling and visiting with a fellow veteran on the phone.

You are being asked to give us one day a year to help with this effort and if we have enough people, we know that our posts will benefit by landing new transfers and renewals. Often times, for a small rural post this effort can be the difference between being an active, viable post in their community or falling into obscurity awaiting cancellation/closure. This event could be the transfusion your post needs to make a strong comeback. *Post Commanders and Adjutants, here is the help you requested in reaching your membership goals*. Don't let this opportunity pass you by.

As part of our preparation for the revitalization with the National Vice Commander, we provided national with a list of zip codes we want targeted during this event. All past/present Legionnaires who live in those zip codes will receive a post card from National HQ letting them

know we will be holding a revitalization on November 3rd. This card will list location/time and include information to let the recipients know what we are doing.

Glenn Wahus – National Vice Commander 2022-2023



Glenn Wahus is a member of American Legion Carl E Rogen Post 29 in Watford City, N.D., and is a U.S. Navy veteran (1983-87). Wahus served as Department of North Dakota commander (2018-2019), and has served on several post, department and national committees, including the National Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Commission (2015-2022). Most recently he has served as the North Dakota Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation chairman. He was instrumental in bringing back the "courage carries on" suicide awareness and prevention program to veterans and youth in North Dakota. Wahus was picked by Governor Doug Burgum to serve on North Dakota's Administrative Committee on Veterans Affairs.
