#### OUR HUMBLE BEGINNINGS By John F. Kopp, Past Commander District Three

As we all know, the year 2019 will mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of The American Legion. While, to some, six years may seem like a long time from now, time seems to fly by faster than we really realize. Before we know it, it will be 2019.

The department is already preparing for the event. Our department convention is scheduled to be held in St. Louis, the location of the first American Caucus. This is where Theodore Roosevelt Jr. really got things going here in America.

We give Roosevelt the deserved honor of forming The American Legion but, just where did he get the idea? Many men of the AEF thought of the idea of forming some sort of alliance when they came home, but so many previous alliances from previous wars faltered with time because they had limited themselves with "conditions" for membership.

But, one day, in 1918, as Lt. Col. Theodore Roosevelt was recovering from his wounds at Base Hospital No. 2 in Paris, he hobbled along a walk and came upon a sergeant resting under a tree. The sergeant, William Patterson, gave Roosevelt a quick salute.

"Expect to get back soon, Sergeant?" Roosevelt asked.

"Yes, sir. Anxious to go back and get the whole job over, sir."

"So am I. But what will we do when all the Germans really are licked?"

"Go home and start a veterans' association for the good of the country, sir," the sergeant answered.

Roosevelt also had many such conversations with other wounded heroes and many had similar idea of some association being formed when they came home. From these conversations Lt. Col. Theodore Roosevelt began developing his ideas. He then met with Lt. Col Franklin D'Olier, our first National Commander, and Lt. Col. Eric Fisher Wood to further develop the idea. From here, Roosevelt invited twenty officers to a dinner at the Allied Officers Club in Rue Faubourg Saint-Honore', saying that he an important unofficial matter to discuss. All accepted the invitation. From this meeting developed plans for the Paris Caucus and the American Caucus. The American Legion was in formation! # DISTRICT MEETINGS

Four times a year District Three holds its quarterly meetings, January, April, June and September on the second Sunday of that month. During the meeting, the district conducts district business, present various people to speak, offer suggestions to post commanders and members from the posts present, and pass along any information obtained from Department. Every other June we have election for district officers. Any American Legion member in good standing (dues paid up) is eligible to be an officer, committee chairperson, or work on a committee.

Your post and your members are vital to The American Legion. Your ideas and suggestions mean a lot to the others posts. We need to share these ideas. I know that for some Commanders and Adjutants it is difficult to attend. But, why not ask another member to attend. That way, your post is represented and the information and ideas presented at the meeting can be brought back and relayed to the other post members.

### DEPARTMENT LOTTERY

This year the Department of Missouri is conducting a lottery. At the bottom of page three you will find the entry form. What the lottery is about is, for every NEW Legion member, the recruiting member fills out this form, signs the bottom and the post adjutant sends it in with the new two parts of the the new member's card. All entries will be placed in a barrel (or something like that) and the winners will be selected during the spring conference in February.

Auxiliary members and Sons of The American Legion are eligible for this. But the new member MUST be joining the Legion. Prizes are: first place - \$1000, second place - \$500, and third place \$250.

At the top of the form, place the recruiter's name and membership number. Below, fill in the new member's information and have the recruiter sign on the line stating' "Name of recruiter." That's it.

Speaking of membership, how can we get new members? Sometimes this question seems like an impossible question to ask. Here are a few suggestions:

The main suggestion is to just ask. Just ask your next door neighbor, the people you work with, members of your church or other organizations you may belong to.

So ask your friends and neighbors first, if they are veterans, then if they would like to join. The worst they can do is say, "No."

Another suggestion is getting your post involved in the schools. When a young man or young woman graduates from high school, if he or she is going to enter the military, help that person throughout his or her boot camp. Then on the day he or she gets out, sign them up. Give them free membership for a while – it is only \$22.50 a year for department and national. Some posts pay the dues fr the entire time that person is on active duty. Send care packages, letters, cards, etc.

Another suggestion is to hold information nights. Brochures can be obtained from department for free. The district has two banners available to use, also.

These are just a few ideas. Something to think about.

Another source of new members is the Post 1000 list. This is a list of American Legion members who do not belong to any post in the Legion. This list can be obtained by the post adjutant who has an account with MyLegion.com as a post adjutant. He or she can search for members living within the area of his or her post simply by doing a search and entering whatever mile radius desired. Then it is just a matter of contacting that person and asking if he or she would like to join your post.
